Casino Can't Keep Up With Its Winnings

Atlantic City — There was so much money to count that the casino opened behind schedule yesterday, but the gamblers quickly made up for lost time.

Resorts International Casino manager Walter I. Rogers said the take from the opening day of legal East Coast casino gambling caused the casino's counting room to operate behind schedule.

He refused to divulge the amount of the handle, saying that it would violate federal securities rules.

The casino, which closed at 6 A.M. yesterday after 20 hours of action, was scheduled to reopen at 10 A.M. Some 5,000 people gathered outside in rainy weather.
